PRESIDENTIAL CLIMATE CHANGE JUST TRANSITION FRAMEWORK CONSULTATION

About The Presidential Climate Commission

The Presidential Climate Commission (PCC) is a multi-stakeholder body established by President Cyril Ramaphosa in 2020 to build a social compact around the climate transition and advise the government on the country's climate change response and pathways, and particularly, on how to ensure that the transition process and outcomes are just.

As part of its work, the Commission is developing a Just Transition Framework: a multipronged practical policy strategy to guide the implementation of necessary interventions across the short-, medium, and long-term to achieve a just transition for South Africa. The PCC aims to build consensus between the social partners, at the same time plans to meet directly with and seek input from communities, affected by the climate change transition. The first of these responses will be in the form of a **Just Transition Framework in 2022** which will be a plan for achieving a just and equitable transition to net-zero CO₂ emissions in South Africa and set out the actions that social partners will take over the short-, medium, and long-run. The Just Transition Framework presents an opportunity to start dealing with issues relating to governance mechanisms, economic diversification tools, labour market interventions, and social support.

Amongst others, the Commission is holding a series of community engagements and consultations across the country. These consultations will feed into a multi-stakeholder conference on the just transition in May 2022, and the completion of a final framework document by mid-2022.

Stakeholders and Community Engagements on Just Transition Framework

There are eight initial key sites across the country where communities and broader social partners should be engaged to solicit their views and inform what constitutes a just transition, build trust and understanding between parties, and broker a social consensus regarding the principal elements of a just transition.
